2023 Scholarships

LAA Scholarship (10) - \$1,250

The Lisbon Alumni Association was established to provide scholarships to eligible graduating seniors for DAHS. Eligibility is based on achieving a minimum grade point average of 3.25 for seven semesters, class rank and references. The selection is done by the LAA board based on GPA, application, essay and one recommendation letter.

J.J. Patsey Scholarship (2) - \$1,000

The scholarship is presented to two graduating seniors who are pursuing a career in the healthcare field. Selection is made by the LAA board from applications submitted for LAA Scholarship.

Kauffman Scholarship - \$1,500

The scholarship is awarded to the graduating senior who may have encountered adverse circumstances beyond his or her control but was able to overcome those issues and emerge successful. The scholarship is given by Dr. Scott Kauffman, a member of the DAHS Class of 1970, and represents his belief that each student has a special talent and deserves the opportunity to pursue that talent. Selection is made by: school counselor, school nurse, high school principal and president of the LAA board.

Marvin White Scholarship - \$5,000

The Marvin White scholarship is awarded to an outstanding graduating senior on the basis of extensive school and community involvement as well as high academic achievement. Selection is made by the LAA board based on application, essay and three (3) letters of recommendation. The awardee is not eligible for the LAA Scholarship.

Lisbon Retired Teachers Scholarship (2) - \$1,000

The scholarship is presented to two graduating seniors who have a minimum GPA of 3.0 and will pursue a career in education. The selection is made by the LAA board based on application, a letter of recommendation from a teacher and three (3) essays.

Borch Scholarship - \$1,250

The Borch Scholarship recognizes an outstanding Columbiana County Career & Technical Center student that plan to continue his or her education. The selection is made by the LAA board based on application, an essay and two (2) letters of recommendation.

Class of 1961 Scholarship - \$1,000

The Class of 1961 Scholarship is awarded to a student who has exhibited good citizenship and a seriousness of purpose. The awardee must have a GPA appropriate for the intended field of study, exhibited good citizenship and leadership; have a record of service to others; possess a seriousness of purpose toward higher education and have financial need. Selection is made by a panel of one high school teacher, the high school guidance counselor, the high school principal or assistant principal, and a member of the LAA Board based on application and essay.

Bruey Pioneer Scholarship - \$1,000

The scholarship is given by David Bruey (Class of 1961) in recognition of a first-generation college student. The awardee must be first generation in his/her immediate family to attend higher education, have worked to help finance his/her higher education, have a financial need, have demonstrated service to others in school and/or community, exhibited a strong desire to pursue higher education and is likely to succeed. Selection is done by panel of one high school teacher, the high school guidance counselor, the high school principal or assistant principal, and a member of the LAA Board based on application and essay.

Iva Chapter O.E.S - \$1,000

This award is given to the fifth (5th) ranked student in the graduation class. There is no application or selection process. The guidance counselor will provide the name of the fifth-ranked student.

Robb/Monter Scholarship - \$1,000 (new)

The scholarship was created in memory of Bernice Robb Monter who spent her entire teaching career at DAHS. She created and maintained a showpiece garden at her home that she bequeathed to LAA. The proceeds from the sale of her home fund the scholarship that is awarded to the outstanding graduating senior who is pursuing a career in horticulture, agriculture, botany, or related field. Selection is done by panel of one high school teacher, the high school guidance counselor, the high school principal or assistant principal, and a member of the LAA Board based on application, two essays and a letter of recommendation.

Robb/Monter Landscape Scholarship - \$500 (new)

The scholarship was created in memory of Bernice Robb Monter who spent her entire teaching career at DAHS. She created and maintained a showpiece garden at her home that she bequeathed to LAA. The proceeds from the sale of her home fund the scholarship that is awarded the sophomore entering the Landscaping Curriculum at Columbiana County Career & Technology Center. Selection is done by the LAA Board based on an essay and letter of recommendation.

Not available in 2023:

David M. Edgerton Scholarship - \$1,000/yr. for 4 years

The scholarship is given by his sons in memory of David Edgerton who owned and operated a grocery store in Lisbon to an outstanding graduating senior who is enrolled in a field of business. A \$1,000 award will be available to the awardee each year for four years. Selection is done by panel of one high school teacher, the high school guidance counselor, the high school principal or assistant principal, and a member of the LAA Board based on application and two essays. The awardee is not eligible for a LAA Scholarship.

Isobel L. Edgerton Scholarship - \$1,000/yr. for 4 years

The scholarship is given by her sons in memory of Isobel Edgerton who was a teacher and librarian to an outstanding graduating senior who is pursuing a career in education. A \$1,000 award will be available to the awardee each year for four years. Selection is done by panel of one high school teacher, the high school guidance counselor, the high school principal or assistant principal, and a member of the LAA Board based on application and two essays. The awardee is not eligible for a LAA Scholarship.
